Please the Bees: Growing Nature, Community and Hope Across Gloucestershire

Across Gloucestershire, a growing community project is quietly making a big impact — not just for bees, but for people too. Please the Bees, founded by local beekeeper Nathan Wylam, is a grassroots initiative dedicated to protecting pollinators while reconnecting communities with nature.



Bees are responsible for pollinating around a third of the food we eat, yet pollinator populations continue to decline due to habitat loss, climate change and pesticide use. Please the Bees works to reverse this trend by creating safe environments where honeybees, bumblebees and other pollinating insects can thrive.

At the heart of the project are community apiaries located on farms, allotments and green spaces across Cheltenham and the wider Gloucestershire area. These sites support local food production by improving pollination of orchards, crops and wild plants, helping biodiversity flourish naturally.



One of the project's most exciting developments is the Honey Plot — land kindly provided by Cheltenham Borough Council — which serves as an educational and wellbeing space for the public. Here, visitors can learn about the inner workings of a hive, attend workshops, and experience beekeeping first-hand. Plans are also underway to introduce a "Human Hive," an immersive structure allowing people to safely step inside and understand how bees live and communicate.



Beyond conservation, Please the Bees highlights the therapeutic benefits of working with nature. For many participants, time spent around the hives offers calm, purpose and improved mental wellbeing. Beekeeping has become a form of nature-based therapy, helping individuals reconnect, learn new skills and build confidence outdoors.

The project continues to expand through community partnerships, school engagement and innovative ideas such as bee-friendly planting schemes and living “bee stops” designed to support urban pollinators.

Residents can support the initiative by adopting a bee through the Please the Bees website, helping fund habitat creation, education programmes and conservation work locally and beyond.

By protecting bees, Please the Bees is helping secure the future of food, wildlife and community wellbeing — proving that small insects can inspire big change.

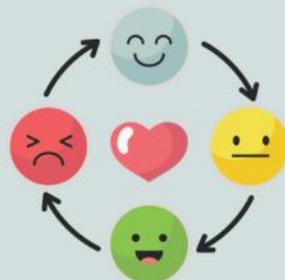

YOGA FOR ALL

Since January a new activity has come to Hester's Way Community Centre – yoga!

Lots of preconceptions exist about yoga – that it's too difficult, or only for people who are able to get into very advanced poses, or you need to invest in fancy mats and leggings before you can get started. Here in Hester's Way we're trying to break down those stereotypes and create a fun, safe and inclusive atmosphere that proves that yoga is for every body!



The physical benefits of yoga have been well documented – improving flexibility, balance, posture and co-ordination. One of the biggest benefits is simply awareness of what your body is doing at any given time – if, like many people in the modern world, you spend much of your day hunched over a computer or steering wheel, you might not be aware of your posture. Yoga helps you to gain this awareness, and, in turn, the knowledge and ability to change the daily habits that might be hurting your joints and muscles.

But another huge benefit of yoga is in its effect on the brain. By moving mindfully, we increase our powers of concentration, which in turn lowers stress and anxiety. One recent study showed that regular yoga students showed lower rates of anxiety, depression and distress than participants in other forms of exercise.

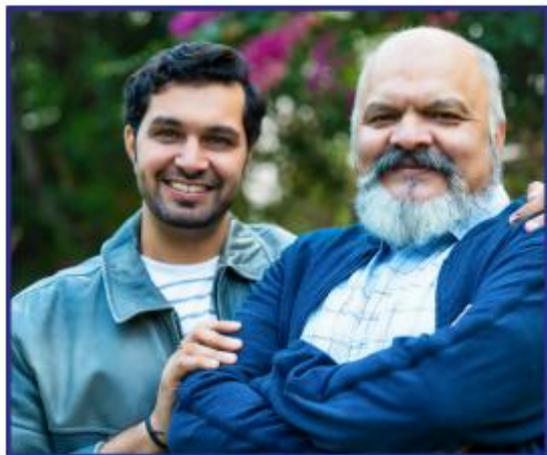

Opening up about memory issues can feel daunting and isolating, but you don't have to face it alone. Age UK Gloucestershire offers a non-medical, tailor-made service to support you or a loved one if you're concerned about memory changes or cognitive function. Our dementia, diagnosis and memory support (DDMS) team are here to support you from the first moment you notice changes in your memory or cognition. It's important to remember that not every memory issue is dementia. However, because of the stigma and fear surrounding dementia, many people delay speaking to loved ones or healthcare professionals. This delay can increase anxiety and uncertainty at a time when reassurance and guidance are most needed. Seeking early help can make a real difference. Whether or not you go on to receive a dementia diagnosis, reaching out sooner can help you understand what's happening, and allow you to breathe a little easier.

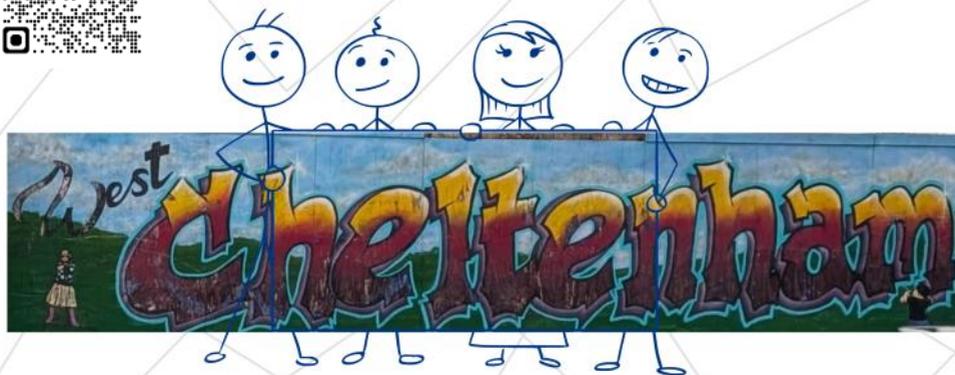
Our dedicated DDMS team are here to listen, answer questions and help alleviate fears in a compassionate and understanding way. Providing emotional support and practical advice such as how to plan ahead and social care options, this non-medical service can be a consistent point of contact throughout the process, so that you're not facing this journey alone.
